Conference: "The Mosaics – Realism in Denmark, Sweden, and Iceland"

October 19th, 2007 9 am – 6 pm, Green College Coach House

The department of CENES presented an exciting and innovative conference, organized by Danish Lecturer Mads Bunch and Swedish Lecturer Lena Karlström, and sponsored by Lektor Puljen, the Danish Lecturers' Abroad fund. Through the course of the day, the conference saw one hundred fifty participants. Mads Bunch opened the day's events with a paper on new trends in Scandinavian Realism. Focusing on new literature by young writers, he described the trend toward realism, which he linked to the Modern Breakthrough of the late 19th century. Danish writer Niels Hav continued with a reading from his collection *We are Here* (2006) and excerpts from the short story "The Turk." The discussion that followed focused on this piece, which critiques limiting labels such as "the Other." Hav has published five books of poetry and three collections of short fiction. He comes to UBC from a nationwide tour of literary festivals. Dr. Wilhelm Emilsson joined us from Douglas College to present a talk entitled "Sagas, Fiction, Reality: The Sagas and Contemporary Icelandic Fiction." Emilsson spoke to the "recycling" of the Saga ideals in contemporary literature and culture in Iceland. Swedish lecturer Lena Karlström began the afternoon with a presentation on new voices in contemporary Swedish prose. She focused on new writers of Sweden with an immigrant background, and introduced the audience to the work of Theodor Kallifatides, Alexandra Pascalidou, Jonas Hassen Khemiri, and others. Khemiri himself followed with a talk entitled "Red-eyed Swedish Tigers: The Transformative Power of Language and Imagination." A self-identified "language nerd" who takes his inspiration from Hip Hop, Khemiri spoke about the relationship between language and power, and questioned the idea that Sweden was ever a homogenous society. Khemiri's novel *One Eye Red* (2003), which won the prize for Best Debut Novel in Sweden, traces the thoughts and dreams of an Arab teenager in Stockholm as he considers his own cultural heritage and social reality. His talk sparked lively discussion that continued during the concluding panel of the conference. The conference concluded with a reception.

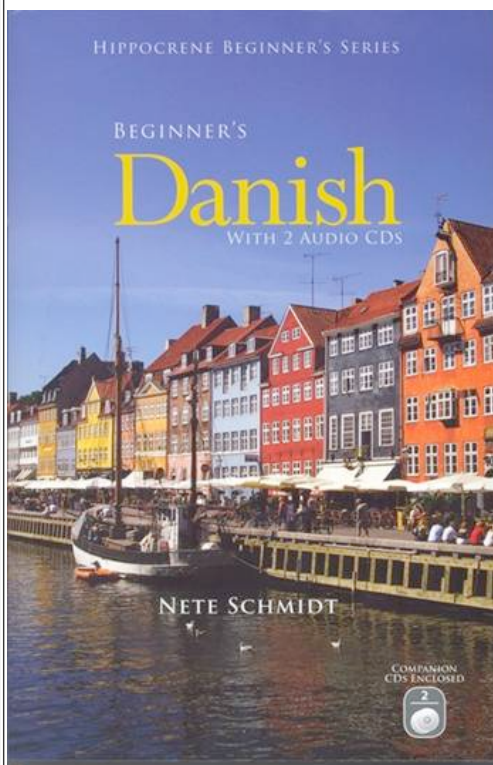
